Last year, the JLD responded to multiple consultations that will have implications for our members, including the <u>SRA consultations on the SQE</u> and the <u>Competition and Markets Authority legal services study</u>. We held two career development forums aimed at trainee and junior solicitors, and two forums for students seeking training positions. The annual conference was a huge success, with sessions on Brexit, working with vulnerable clients and developing an international career.

<u>The new JLD committee 2016-17</u> is made up of representatives from across England and Wales and is dedicated to representing the interests of our members.

The Committee's focus for this year includes:

- representing current and future junior lawyers in relation to the SRA proposal for a centralised assessment to qualify as a solicitor

- promoting mental health wellbeing and resilience in an increasingly stressful profession
- promoting diversity within the junior lawyers division.
